What is a 3 Steps for Life awareness session?

A 3 Steps for Life awareness session is for members of the community to introduce them to life saving skills for people in cardiac arrest. The awareness session will cover basic CPR and AED skills, and runs for approximately 45 minutes.

Hato Hone St John's commitment to community wellbeing includes the delivery of the 3 Steps for Life community workshops. Where you can confidently learn CPR and how to use an AED. The next free workshop takes place Dec 1st. Thank you to Jenni Edwards for leading this project and local kaumatua Junior Wairepo for blessing our AED.

ECCS Grant

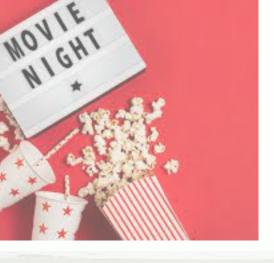
