
### **Community Wellbeing**

### **TCDC Planned Works**

TCDC have also committed to essential works to improve our facility and ensure a safe and comfortable space for all. We are clear on all necessary actions to increase hall occupancy, including displaying emergency signage, bathroom refurbishment and installation of panic fasteners. Borer control and gutter cleaning have been confirmed and booked. We are moving forward with the installation of a underflooring water barrier to help prevent borer. TCDC funding for insulation has also been approved. We are in the process of reviewing quotes for heating options, which will be essential for ensuring a warm and welcoming space during the winter months and wetter climates.
